**Description:** This SRM is a low alloy, high silicon (nominally 3 %) steel intended primarily for checking and/or calibrating carbon/sulfur analyzers. One unit of SRM 131g consists of 150 g of chips, sized between 0.5 mm and 1.0 mm sieve openings (35 mesh and 18 mesh, respectively).

**Disposal:** SRM 131g should be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations.
